Financial Aid: Students in need of assistance with their educational expenses may apply for financial aid. Students who have not yet received a bachelor's degree will be considered for Federal grant assistance. All students will be considered for the Federal Direct Loans (up to \$5,500 Subsidized and \$2,000 Unsubsidized) and WWU grants (up to \$9,200). Funding for Nursing Loans is limited and will be awarded (up to \$3,000) to eligible students until funds are depleted in the order students complete their financial aid application file. Independent students may also borrow (up to \$5,000) on an Unsubsidized Direct Loan.

Financial Aid Process: The 2011-12 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) should be submitted no later than two months prior to registration. Walla Walla University's Financial Aid Application (FAA) should be sent directly to WWU. The FAFSA is online at fafsa.ed.gov. The FAA is online at sfs.wallawalla.edu/application. The Federal Government selects 30% of the applications for a verification process. If you are selected, you will be notified and be required to complete a verification statement and submit tax papers. (Dependent students will be required to submit their parents' tax papers also).

Financial Aid Deadlines: All forms should be at the Walla Walla University Student Financial Services Office no later than one month before registration in order for financial aid to be awarded by registration time. Only aid that has already been awarded by registration time may be deducted from the estimated costs. Students who submit applications, corrections, or other required information less than 2 weeks before the start of classes may encounter delays at registration unless they can cover the quarter's expenses without financial aid assistance. Several aid programs have an April 30 deadline. Students missing this deadline may miss up to \$800 in financial aid grants.

Payment Plans:

1. Regular Payment Plan: Payment in full (plus any previous balance) will be due on the day of registration. Awarded financial aid may be deducted from the estimated cost.
2. Monthly Payment Plan: The quarter's expenses, less any awarded financial aid, are divided into three equal payments. The first payment, plus any previous balance, is due prior to registration. The second and third payments are due the following months on the 25th of each month. Finance charges will accrue on the unpaid balance. This payment plan is available only for US and Canadian residents. All other student must use the Regular Payment Plan.

Files: Please note that all Admissions and Financial Aid Files (for Portland Campus students) are kept on the main campus in College Place, WA.
