

## **RN Advanced Placement Information**

### **Walla Walla University**

In order for an RN to transfer to Walla Walla University, the nursing graduate would be required to meet the same minimum admissions requirements as all other Walla Walla University undergraduate applicants as listed below. Applicants must:

1. Have a current unencumbered RN Oregon license.
2. Have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or above.
3. Have completed the following pre-requisite courses from a regionally accredited university or community college. (See transfer guide for appropriate courses from various local colleges.)
  - 6 credits of College Writing (English Composition)
  - 3 credits of Research Writing
  - 2 credits of Physical Education (activity courses)
  - Full sequence of Anatomy & Physiology with lab (credits cannot be more than 5 years old)
  - Microbiology with lab (credits cannot be more than 5 years old)
  - 8 credits of Introductory Chemistry with lab (credits cannot be more than 5 years old)
  - Human Nutrition
  - Applied Statistics (must have a MATH prefix or additional math courses may be required)
  - General Psychology
  - General Sociology
  - Human Development
  - General studies history courses – 8 credits
  - Humanities – 12 credits
  - (Please note: Religion courses are not a pre-requisite to be accepted)
4. Have completed enough additional transferable credits to be classified as a college senior (136 credits).
5. Pass a standardized examination to validate nursing knowledge to receive advanced standing as a senior level student. (Validation exam only needed if student has been licensed for more than 5 years.) Based on successful completion of this exam, RNs with a current license are granted 15 lower division nursing credits and 29 upper division nursing credits and are exempt from taking [NRSG 210, 211, 212, 213, 321, 331, 344 and 354](#).
6. Submit the completed School of Nursing application along with the application to the University.
7. Submit three letters of recommendation (prefer teacher, employer or co-worker).
8. Have a score of 80 or above on the required reading test. Schedule with advisor. See the *Financial Bulletin* for required testing fee.
9. Have a score of 80 or above on the required math test. Schedule with advisor. See the *Financial Bulletin* for required testing fee.
10. Have a score of 17 or above on the required critical reasoning test. Schedule with advisor. See the *Financial Bulletin* for required testing fee.

After acceptance into the School of Nursing, the following are required:

1. Provide documentation of required immunizations.
2. Provide documentation of current health insurance.
3. Provide documentation of current American Heart Association cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certification for health care providers. Current CPR certification must be maintained while enrolled in the nursing program.
4. Purchase the standard School of Nursing uniform, available at the School of Nursing office.

Acceptance of RNs in the Walla Walla University Bachelor of Science nursing program is based on available space.
